## RULES

1. **Exhibitor Eligibility— Competition in this show is limited to Tennessee members. Only a 4-H, FFA or Junior Breed Association member may exhibit animals in this show and they must not have passed their 21st birthday on January 1 of the current year. Junior exhibitors must show their own animals without assistance. If the department head ask a junior exhibitor for proof of age, they must be able to show proof of age, such as driver's license, birth certificate, or other ID showing date of birth.**
2. **Eligibility—Only animals officially recorded in the name of the exhibitor prior to July 10th may be shown, and the registration certificate shall be submitted to the Dept. Head of the show. All animals must be registered or recorded with their respective breed organizations. Entries must be in the sole, name of the 4-H, FFA or Junior Breed Association member ONLY. Animals registered in the family, farm, chapter or club name will not be eligible to show in the Junior Show.**
3. NO lease will be accepted/honored.
4. Health - General rules relating to livestock health and sanitation requirements for all animals exhibited at the Tennessee State Fair apply to exhibitor and animals competing in this division. **ALL SWINE MUST HAVE A CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION. REGISTERED PURE BRED ANIMALS WILL BE IDENTIFIED BY EAR NOTCH, MATCHING THE REGISTRATION PAPER. CROSSBREDS MUST HAVE A 840 EAR TAG FOR IDENTIFICATION PURPOSES.**
5. ALL animals will be Vet checked before unloading and entrance to the facilities, during the arrival times listed above. No animals will be accepted for show after the 9:00 p.m. arrival cut-off time.
6. Each exhibitor is allowed to show a maximum of two animals in each class. One animal must be shown by owner and each animal must be accompanied by a junior exhibitor while in the ring. Only two monies will be paid any exhibitor in any class.
7. Entry - All entries shall be verified by the Department Head of the show prior to day of show.
8. Premiums will be paid out to the top 5 placings of each class by a Danish distribution.
9. A RELEASE FORM IS REQUIRED FOR ALL LIVESTOCK.
10. NO BEDDING WILL BE FURNISHED BY THE FAIR. Exhibitors can bring their own bedding or bedding can be purchased from the Livestock Office
11. The Swine Dept. Head will supervise the penning of animals so that space may be used to the best advantage. If you have a penning requirement, note it on your entry form.
12. An animal not eligible to show in one of the registered breed shows (class) can be eligible to show in the AOB or Crossbreed's show (class). An animal can only be shown in one show (class).
13. Crossbreed Gilt and Barrow Shows will be divided into classes by weight, with no class having more than 10 head.
14. **Resisted purebred barrows will be shown in the breed classes listed, all others will be in the crossbred class. Purebred barrows must be registered and/or transferred into their respective breeds, note Rule #2 above.**



## Weigh-in Procedures for Crossbred Gilts and Barrow Shows

- ⇒ Weights will be declared. At check-in you will receive a weigh card for cross bred gilts and all barrows with an allotted number. There will be a set of digital crate scales open for weighing as often as the exhibitor sees fit in order to declare their desired weight.
- ⇒ The exhibitor is responsible for paint branding their animal with the number on the weigh card presented to them at check-in and placing their declared weight on the card that corresponds with that animal.
- ⇒ Declared weight range for eligible swine must be between 215 and 305, there will be a 15 pound +/- from the declared weight. (Example: Declared weight is 250. That animal must weigh between 235 and 265 at the time of the show.)
- ⇒ All crossbred gilt weigh cards must be turned in to the show staff by no later than 8:45 am Saturday morning. All barrow weigh cards must be turned in by 5 pm Saturday afternoon to the show staff. Failure to turn in your weigh card by the deadline will result in forfeiture of that animal.
- ⇒ The top three animals in each class that were determined by weight must weigh back. If all animals are within their declared weight the placings stand. If an animal is not within the limit, that placing is forfeited and all animals move up one placing that are below said animal. In the event that there are no digital crate scales available there will be a certified weigh master on hand to perform weigh backs after classes.

**\*If total premiums won exceed the amount offered by the TN State Fair of \$8,376 , then individual premium amounts will be prorated. Only two monies will be paid to an exhibitor in one particular class.**

## Skillathon

### Division 610

This event consists of different activities that will evaluate an exhibitor's knowledge gained from participation in the swine project for a total of 100 points. Each exhibitor will participate in the skillathon as an individual. The activities will increase in difficulty as the grade division increases.

Examples of skillathon activities include but are not limited to:

- \*Feed identification
- \*Breed identification
- \*Meat identification
- \*Health Practices
- \*Production practices & records

Whatever grade the exhibitor was in on January 1st, of the current year, will be the division that they compete in.

The grade divisions will be as follows:

- Cls 01. 4th—5th grades (**eligible for the Premier Exhibitor Award**)
- Cls 02. 6th—8th grades (**eligible for the Premier Exhibitor Award**)
- Cls 03. 9th—12th grades (**eligible for the Premier Exhibitor Award**) must not have passed their 21st birthday on January 1 of the current year

## Junior Showmanship

### Division 611

- After all participants in each age group have been observed by the judge, the top 5 in the line-up will be considered in the finals for prize awards.
- In a showmanship division, if there is more than 10 youth, the Class will be divided accordingly.
- Whatever grade the exhibitor was in on January 1st, of the current year, will be the division that they compete in.

Cls 01. 9th—12th grades, (**eligible for the Premier Exhibitor Award**), must not have passed their 21st birthday on January 1 of the current year.

Cls 02. 6th—8th grades (**eligible for the Premier Exhibitor Award**)

Cls 03. 4th—5th grades (**eligible for the Premier Exhibitor Award**)

Cls 04. Younger than 4th grade

## Tennessee Premier Exhibitor Award

### Division 612

The points for the 2017 State 4-H & FFA Market Hog Show held in January 2017 and the points from the 2017 Tennessee State Fair Junior Swine Events will be combined to reach the Tennessee Premier Exhibitor Award(s). The top (5) five placings in each division will be announced. The points are combined from each area of the show (Skillathon, Showmanship and Highest placing animal from the Gilt Show or the Barrow Show.) Exhibitors must enter all three of the

below events to be considered for the Tennessee Premier Exhibitor Award.

- A. Skillathon: The event consists of different activities that will evaluate an exhibitor’s knowledge gained from participation in the swine project for a total of 100 points. Each exhibitor will participate in the skillathon as an individual. The activities will increase in difficulty as the grade division increases. Examples of skillathon activities include but are not limited to:
- Feed identification
  - Breed identification
  - Meat identification
  - Health practices
  - Production practices & records
- B. Gilt or Barrow Show: Each exhibitor will receive a score for their highest placing animal as follows;
